

Remote Learning Expectations

As the school year progresses and Somerset County remains in the “substantial” category, we will remain in remote learning. We will shift from asynchronous learning to synchronous learning. This means students will have a combination of posted assignments and live video lessons or recorded video lessons. Each class will progress differently within the virtual model. It is important for students to engage in all learning activities provided by the teacher. It is the student’s responsibility to complete all assignments and participate in the lessons.

Outlined below are the updated expectations for remote learning.

Attendance: Report attendance by **8:15 AM**

- Students with internet access will be required to complete the attendance form. ****The form is emailed to parents/students daily at 7:00 AM.***
- Students without internet access will call the appropriate school office to check in for the day. 814-926-4688
- Student participation will also be determined by completion of the assignments and activities.
- *****New - student attendance will be taken each period during video lessons.**

To access the virtual live lessons each teacher will email or post within their google classroom the video link to attend the lesson.

Elementary students should follow their schedule to complete video lessons, The child’s teachers will support students by outlining the virtual lessons/activities for the day. The activities and assignments assigned by their teachers will be found on the Google Classroom as they normally do during a regular virtual school day.

1. Virtual lessons will be held at a minimum every Tuesday & Thursday. Each teacher will schedule their virtual lessons with their students.
 - a. K-3 lessons will focus on reading and mathematics. K-3 teachers will coordinate virtual lessons for other subjects as needed.
 - b. 4th through 6th grade lessons will cover all core subjects.
2. Instructional content will be recorded from each of the live lessons to share with students in need of offline videos.
3. Follow your daily schedule. The first live lesson will be held this Tuesday, Dec. 8th
4. Participate in the class virtual lesson each day. **The virtual portion of the lesson could be up to 40 minutes. Teachers will take attendance each lesson.*
5. Complete and submit the required assignments.
6. Check your student email at least 2-3 times each day for feedback and updates provided by your teachers. Example - Check it the morning, after lunch, and at the end of the day.
 - a. Teachers, please communicate information related to student email addresses for parents to support their children.

On an individual basis students without internet will coordinate work with the regular classroom teacher and the Elementary office. If additional offline resources are necessary, students will be provided with a flash drive with preloaded digital resources. The distribution and collection of offline materials will be through District transportation.

Completion of Assignments:

In order to receive credit for completed assignments, students are required to submit their coursework the day the assignments are provided or on the designated due date. *Submitting all assignments on the last day is not acceptable. Students are responsible for keeping up with their assignments and coursework on a daily basis.

*Offline coursework due dates will be coordinated with the teacher.
