Superintendent's Report:

Mark Bower informed the Board that the district had a great start to the school year. The construction from the restroom and locker room alterations project is nearly complete, and the custodial/maintenance staff did a fantastic job cleaning and preparing the building for the start of the year, especially those areas affected by the project.

Mark Bower advised the Board of some minor transportation issues the district has been dealing with; however, each situation is being managed.

Mark Bower recognized the Class of 1965 for their generosity in donating instruments and funds to the district's band program.

Mark Bower informed the Board that Ed Clay contacted a company for a quote to replace the district's chair lift.

Mark Bower reminded the Board they have all been invited to attend the SCTC All-Board Dinner and Tour.

Misty Demchak reviewed activities associated with the annual homecoming event, which will be held on Saturday, September 23, 2023. The powderpuff game will take place on Friday, September 22nd.

Misty Demchak gave an update on the World of Learning (WOL) program. The district continues to work through some minor issues; however, the students are adjusting well to the program. Mrs. Jill Morgan has been doing a fantastic job teaching the French expos.

Misty Demchak informed the Board that yearbooks have been received and will be distributed to students within the next few days.

Misty Demchak advised the Board that Megan Snell, district photographer, and Ms. Juliann Picklo have been working together to take photos of all district related events, including athletic competitions.

Nicholas Buterbaugh discussed school safety and security. He recently met with other safety coordinators and found our district to be standing in a good place with the safety and security procedures the district has in place.

Nicholas Buterbaugh continues to correspond and work with coaches and students in regards to athletics. He has been monitoring transportation concerns related to extracurricular activities and events.

Jon Hale informed the Board that the beginning of the school year for elementary students had a great start, and events that have already occurred, such as grandparents' day, were well attended.

Jon Hale advised the Board that many programs and assessments have been started in the elementary, a few include: MTSS/IST meetings, Guided Reading, DIBELS 8 assessments, and DRA assessments.

Jon Hale informed the Board that fundraisers for the playground renovation project have begun. He expects to receive a quote for the project by mid-October and is also awaiting information regarding an engineering proposal for the project.

Jon Hale advised the Board that bus safety and behavior lessons were completed on September 18th. These lessons focused on student safety around the bus and general bus rules. Activity packets were sent home with students.

Mark Bower recognized Megan Hetrick for her efforts and commitment in supporting the district while she is on maternity leave.

Jordan Svonavec reviewed purchases made through the government surplus program. He was able to purchase discounted items for the district, such as instruments for the band program and furniture.

Jordan Svonavec discussed the reasoning behind parents receiving P-EBT cards. Any student who was eligible for free or reduced-price school meals and enrolled into May 2023 with a school that participates in the National School Lunch Program/School Breakfast Program was eligible to receive a summer 2023 P-EBT benefit. Jordan plans to provide clarification by sharing this information with parents through a SchoolMessenger announcement.
