For our last month of second grade you will be able to choose a project that you would like to create and learn from - we hope to learn from you too! We are going to be with you and your family to help you along the way! On the bottom of the page are some project ideas and activities you could use as your project - it is not the expectation that you do all of the activities we have listed- just choose one. The beauty of this project is that you can make the project what you want, as simple or as in-depth as you would like. You can even come up with your own project if you choose!

This project is not meant to be stressful, the open-endedness of this project allows us to adapt the projects to your family situations. Your project will need to be completed by **Friday, May 22, 2020**. This means that you will have plenty of time to work, but you will need to pace yourself so that you are not rushing at the end.

Here is a list of possible projects:

- Time Capsule- Collect information and record your thoughts from this period in time!
- Historian's Journal- Record your thoughts and feelings about this time and even interview other people!
- Teach Your Teacher- Think about the things you know a lot about, they might be things that your teacher would like to learn about!
- Book Exploration- Explore different types of book genres and keep track of the books that you have read!
- Photography- Like to use the camera? This is like a scavenger hunt, only when you find something in this hunt you take a picture of it!
- Special Interest Project- Find something that really interests you and talk with your teacher about how to make it a project!
- Packets of Papers- Want something easy to follow that is already outlined? The packet of papers is your way to go then! These are the papers that you received in your envelope)
