## Areas of Focus

- Music Literacy-reading pitch and rhythm
- Knowledge of musical styles and related world and music history
- Performance Skills-vocal technique, diction, ear-training and sight-singing


## Concert Dress

$\square$ Ladies-Black skirt (discreet in length) or dress pants, white blouse or top, black dress shoes. (Modest jewelry, nothing flashy or distracting)
$\square$ Gentleman-Black dress pants, white dress shirt, tie, black socks, black dress shoes.

## Materials:

Each student will be assigned a numbered rehearsal folder. Folders will be kept on the shelf inside the chorus room door. Each student will receive a choir pencil-keep this in your folder; if your pencil is lost or stolen, it is your responsibility to replace it by the next rehearsal. MUSIC-please keep up to date with current music that should be in your folder.

## Ensemble Behavior

Our choral ensembles are essentially music teams. It is essential for the members to display hard work and a good attitude. In return they will have a rewarding experience where they can learn qualities such as team work, perseverance and personal discipline. The actions of any individual can either help or hinder the entire ensemble in both rehearsal and performance. Self-discipline is not optional: it is required. Repeat offenders will be removed from the class at the director's discretion.

Expected Behavior/Daily Participation

- Class preparation
- In seat and quiet when class begins
- Quiet during rehearsal when not singing
- Demonstrates correct posture while singing
- Respect for self and others
- Participates appropriately during rehearsal

Each Class:

- Students will earn daily participation points by following the expected behavior outlined in the handbook. Every expected behavior not followed will result in a $1 / 2$ point deduction.
- If disregard for expected behavior continues to occur, student will receive a Level I detention.


## Procedures and Routines

[] Be on time and in your assigned spot- 1 minute after late bell.
[] Participate in all classroom activities
[] Be Prepared! Have your folder of music and a pencil.
[] No food, GUM, soda, iced tea, etc.

## Performances

As this is a performance-based class, attendance at all performances is mandatory. The dates are listed on the first page of this handbook. Please put these dates on your calendar now so that you can schedule around them. Why is attendance mandatory at performances?

- Performance for an audience is a primary focus of this class. Concerts provide an experience that cannot be reproduced in the classroom.
- Performances are the means by which the skills learned in class are evaluated.
- Choral singing is a group effort. The performance is weakened by every missing voice. We rehearse together and we perform together.


## Grading

Grades are earned by assessing student's knowledge (classroom assignments, quizzes), skills (sight-singing and ear-training), and participation in daily rehearsals and required performances. Grades will be assessed on a point system as follows:

- Rehearsals (one hundred points total)
- Classroom assignments and quizzes (fifty points)
- Performance attendance (one hundred points)

1. The performance of the chorus is a primary function of the class and therefore attendance is required.
2. Written excuses may be considered when submitted at least two weeks prior to the concert if the excuse is valid.
3. Unexcused absences for the performance will result in no points being issued for that performance. A make-up assignment can be completed for $75 \%$ of the normal performance grade.
4. If the concert is missed due to an excused absence (extreme illness or approval by director), a make-up assignment will be assigned and will be due within five days of the student's return to school.

Please read and discuss this entire handbook with your student before signing and returning the signature page. Remember to please return the completed signature page to Mr . Spiri by Friday, September 8th. (This is assignment \#1-worth 10 points.) Make sure to keep the concert schedule, and mark the dates on your calendar. If any changes occur, you will be notified as soon as possible!
