Superintendent's Report:

Mark Bower updated the Board on the backpack program. The District is in year two of the program and serves approximately 100 students; with an increase of 25 students from the first year. The program has also been expanded into 7th grade this year.

Mark Bower updated the Board on the Raise.Me program and informed the Board that a student recently has been awarded over \$8,000.00 in micro scholarships. There have also been 20 colleges added to the list of eligible schools.

Mark Bower informed the Board that Sharon Clapper will be in the District on Thursday to start career planning activities for the year.

Mark Bower informed the Board that Somerset Planning has accumulated approximately \$13,000.00 for additional services for the months of July and August. The District has paid them approximately \$35,000.00 to date. Mark and Brian will be discussing the additional invoices with Somerset Planning and bring a recommendation back to the Board in October.
